PART-B

1. ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION:

When higher education was beyond the reach of the oppressed and economically marginalized young generation in and around Tiruchirappalli region, Thanthai Periyar, the visionary leader and social reformer generously donated 9.65 acres of land in addition to 3.5 lakh rupees to the Government of Tamil Nadu with a request to start a Government college in Tiruchirappalli town, to cater to the needs of them in the field of higher education. Utilizing the philanthropic help of Thanthai Periyar, the Government of Tamil Nadu started a Government college at Khajamalai near Mannarpuram, Tiruchirappalli during the academic year 1965 – 1966 and named it as Periyar E.V.R. College. The then Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Honorable M. Bhakthavatchalam inaugurated the college on 24.08.1965. The college campus has expanded to 52.62 acres with adequate class rooms and necessary infrastructural facilities.

In the annals of the college, the academic year 1998-1999 proved to be significant on two counts. The college became co-educational institution and the college became autonomous resulting in a sea change in aims and goals of the institution.

The college is now offering 14 UG and 13 PG programmes in addition to PG diploma in one department. Eleven departments have been recognized as research centres both by the Government of Tamil Nadu and Bharathidasan University, which offer M. Phil. / Ph.D. in full time and part time basis. 3014 students are pursuing their higher studies both in regular and shift systems. 90% of them belong to oppressed and economically marginalized who hail from rural background. Many of them are first generation learners. In all, Periyar E.V.R College performs the role of uplifting the poor students by providing them holistic higher education and make responsible individuals who are inclined to serve their families, society and ultimately the nation.

In the year 2000, the Computer Literacy Programme introduced by the Government of Tamil Nadu in order to help the Non-computer science students and it has been functioning effectively. As a part of the policy of the Government of Tamil Nadu, Special Shift System (SSS) was introduced in this Institution in the year 2006 to enrol more number of students with the available infrastructure.

It has faculty strength of 168 members of whom 73 members have acquired Ph.D. degree. The development of the college in the academic, extra – curricular and extension programmes are due to the able leadership of several academics who served as Principals of this college.

The academic profile of the staff of the college is quite impressive. 97% of the staff holds M.Phil, and 43% of the staff holds Ph.D. The Bharathidasan University recognizes many of the staff members as research supervisors who are guiding Ph.D and M.Phil. research scholars. The faculty together with the principal forms an efficient team that can respond to the ever changing needs of the institution.

The College, which was originally affiliated to Madras University, came under the jurisdiction of Bharathidasan University since 1982. Since 2005 onwards, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Semester Pattern has been followed. Since 2008 onwards, the Revised Choice Based Credit System (RCBCS) system has been followed on par with the University pattern. Even otherwise the courses prescribed for Part IV (Skill Based Electives) has been slightly modified in accordance with the requirements of the students and the availability of the infrastructures. These CBCS and RCBCS Pattern enable the students to enlighten themselves in different fields by choosing the options in the elective courses of their own interest.

During the Centenary celebration of the Ex-Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Honorable C. N. Annadurai, the Government sanctioned a sum of Rs.150 lakhs to the college in 2009 for the construction of new building. 18 class rooms and 2 Science laboratories were constructed from this amount during 2009 and it started functioning from 2010. Later in 2010, 21 more new class rooms were built from the additional grant of Rs.100 lakhs from the same fund.

The Rs.50 Lakhs auditorium was constructed in the college with a capacity of accommodating 600 persons out of the constituency development fund of Rajya Sabha MP Mr. Tiruchy N. Siva and was inaugurated in 2010. The gesture of Mr. Tiruchy N. Siva, an alumnus, has fulfilled the need of the college and it is being apt for the conduct of graduation ceremony, inter-collegiate events, and all other academic functions.

- To make extension service is a part of the curriculum.
- To provide more facility for the development of sports activities.
- To strengthen the library.

- All UG and PG courses of the college were running on Semester Pattern.

5. EXAMINATION REFORMS IMPLEMENTED:

- ✓ Semester Pattern of Examination is introduced.
- ✓ Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) system has been introduced as a part of RCBCS pattern to all Under Graduate and Post Graduate courses from the academic year 2005-2006.
- ✓ Students have to write two CIA tests in a semester for all the papers.
- ✓ Seminars, Assignments are Attendances are taken into consideration for Internal Marks.
- ✓ Post graduate students undertake the Projects in their Fourth semester.
- ✓ Academic Calendar is prepared and followed by the institution for its various activities like tests, semester examinations etc.
- ✓ A Committee was constituted for the preparation of question Bank.
- ✓ For all UG, PG and Research Programmes semester Question Papers are purely set by External Examiners.

- ✓ Question Paper Scrutiny Committee is formed to scrutinize the question papers before the examinations to avoid (a) out of syllabi questions (b) repetitions of questions (c) typographical errors and to assess the merit and standard of the questions selected.
- ✓ Question paper pattern for certain courses are revised so that more emphasis is given to test the basic understanding of the concepts and to improve the problem solving skills.
- ✓ Instant Examinations is conducted for the unsuccessful candidates within 15 days of publishing the results of the semester examinations and thereby the candidates have the advantage of going with the regular stream without losing semester.
